#### PATHWAY 1: National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA)

This is New Zealand's national qualification for senior secondary students, offering a broad and flexible framework that's highly regarded worldwide. NCEA is taught over three years in Years 11, 12 and 13.

#### PATHWAY 2: International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB)

Taught over Years 12 and 13, this is a rigorous academic programme that focuses on developing inquisitive, knowledgable and caring young people who live, learn and work in a rapidly changing world.
